Gordon Goodrow

Detective Gordon Goodrow, Lower Paxton Police Department, is a sexual violence investigator and 20-year police veteran. His presentation will discuss the most effective methods of interviewing a victim designed to maximize victim disclosure, trust and involvement. Much of his knowledge was gained by closely working with forensic nurses at Harrisburg Hospital. He will also discuss successful interrogation methods for eliciting confessions from sexual violence suspects.

Veronique Valliere, Psy.D.

Dr. Valliere serves on the Pennsylvania Sexual Offenders Assessment Board. She received her doctorate in Clinical Psychology from the Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology and has 18 years experience in individual/group treatment with domestic and sexual violence perpetrators and survivors. Her program treats offenders incarcerated in federal, state and county facilities, as well as state hospitals. Dr. Valliere conducted a presentation on sex offenders at the National Center for the Prosecution of Violence Against Women and has been a guest presenter at numerous forensic and abuse conferences. She has trained judges, state police officers and polygraphists, and currently trains Pennsylvania parole agents on the supervision of violent offenders.
